Continuity replaced by DISRUPTION

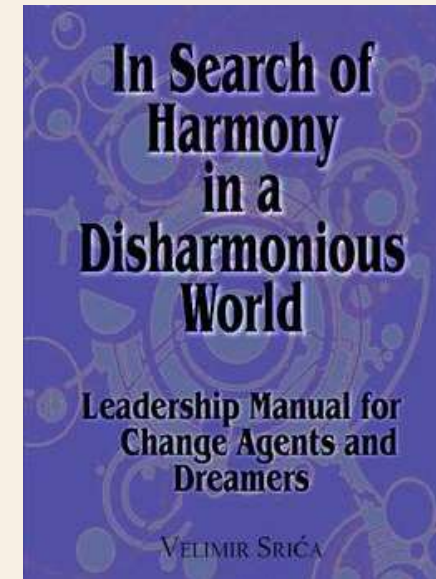
In Zulu, **VUCA** means “wake up”

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Cronical disruption

- „Cooking a frog” 30 years:
 - Kids outside a wedlock - 15% to 70%
 - Trust in government - 85% to 15%
 - Trust in „business people” - 65% to 18%
 - Trust in media - 78% to 27%
 - Trust in science - 89% to 65%
 - Trust in church - 82% to 34%



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Acute disruption

- Two pandemics and wars
- Global ecological crisis
- Inflation, fear of recession
- The "Cold War" is back
- Weakening of the "global order"
- The danger of nuclear conflict
- Distorted moral compass



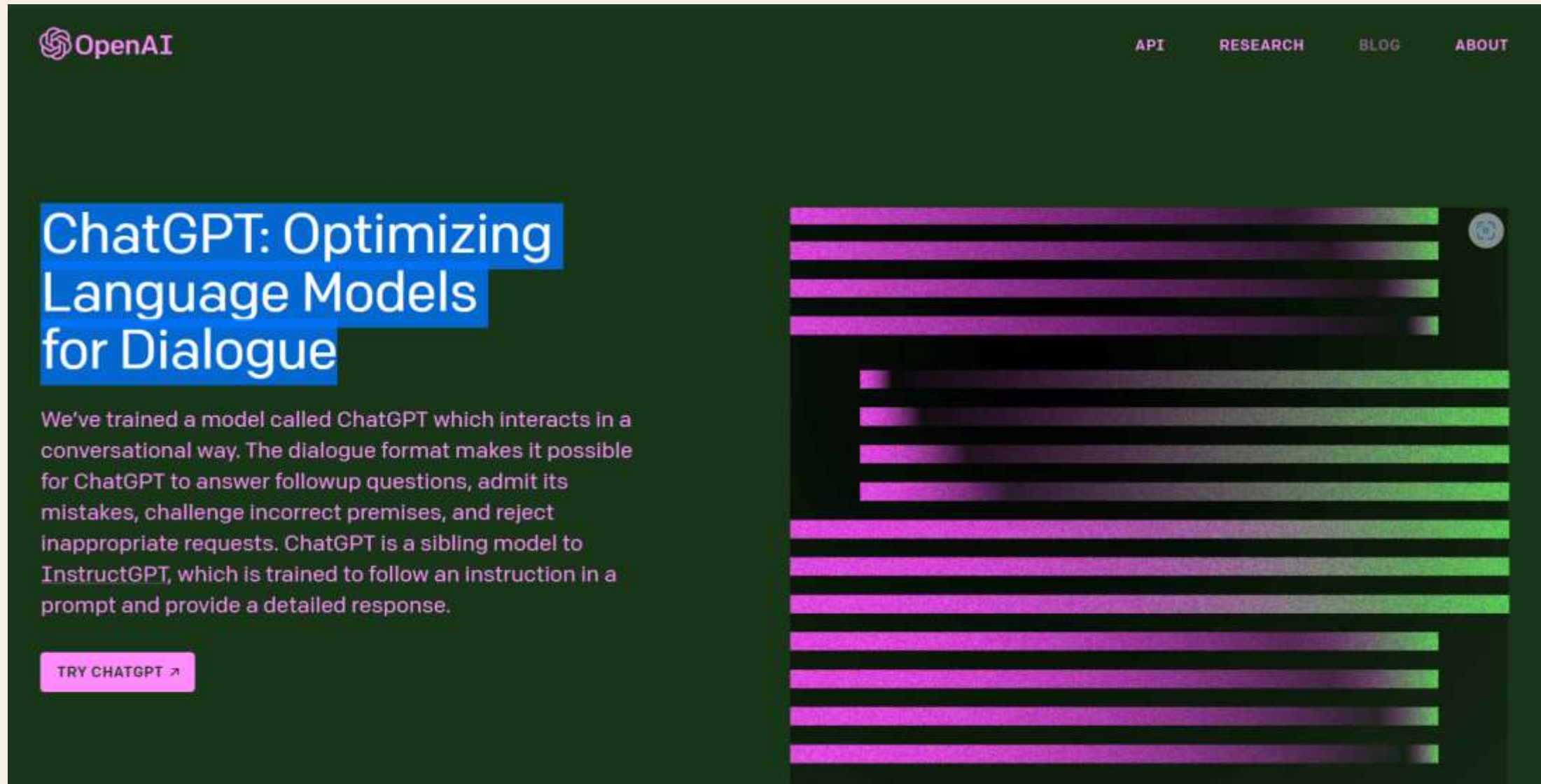
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Digital disruption

- Teenagers spend 8 hours 23 minutes on mobile devices , 52' on TikTok
- 9 - 16% Facebook profiles are fake

AI and ChatGPT 4 dilemmas



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Human disruption

- 40% of USA households have one member, 70 million singles in EU
- Friendship Recession - 338 Facebook friends and 3-8 real friends
- The rise of mental illness and chronic depression
- Radicalization through social networks (fake news, conspiracy theories)
- Stochastic terrorism (mass and often random killing)
- Increasingly vague gender role
- Young generations avoid sex



Motivational Disruption 2018

- Gallup's State of the Global Workplace
- Survey of 142 countries, close to 1,5 billion workers
- 13% „engaged" – passionately working to „change the world"
- 63% „nonengaged" – disinterested in job and company
- 24% „actively disengaged" – negative, come to workplace to „bother" others



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Motivational Disruption 2023

- Gallup's State of the Global Workplace 2023
- 23% engaged employees - feel involved in and enthusiastic about their work
- 62% employees not engaged - show up, do the bare minimum, uninspired by their work
- 15% employees actively disengaged – feel miserable at job, actively seeking a new one

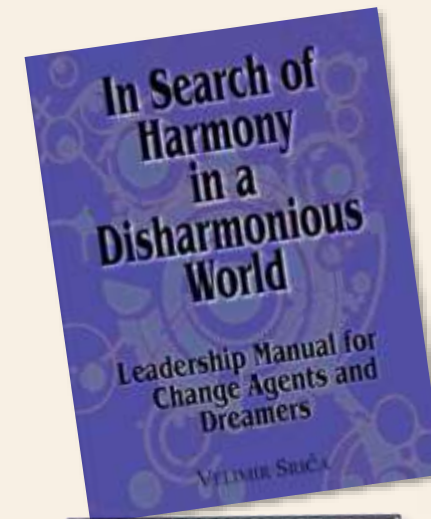


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10 deadly sins of education

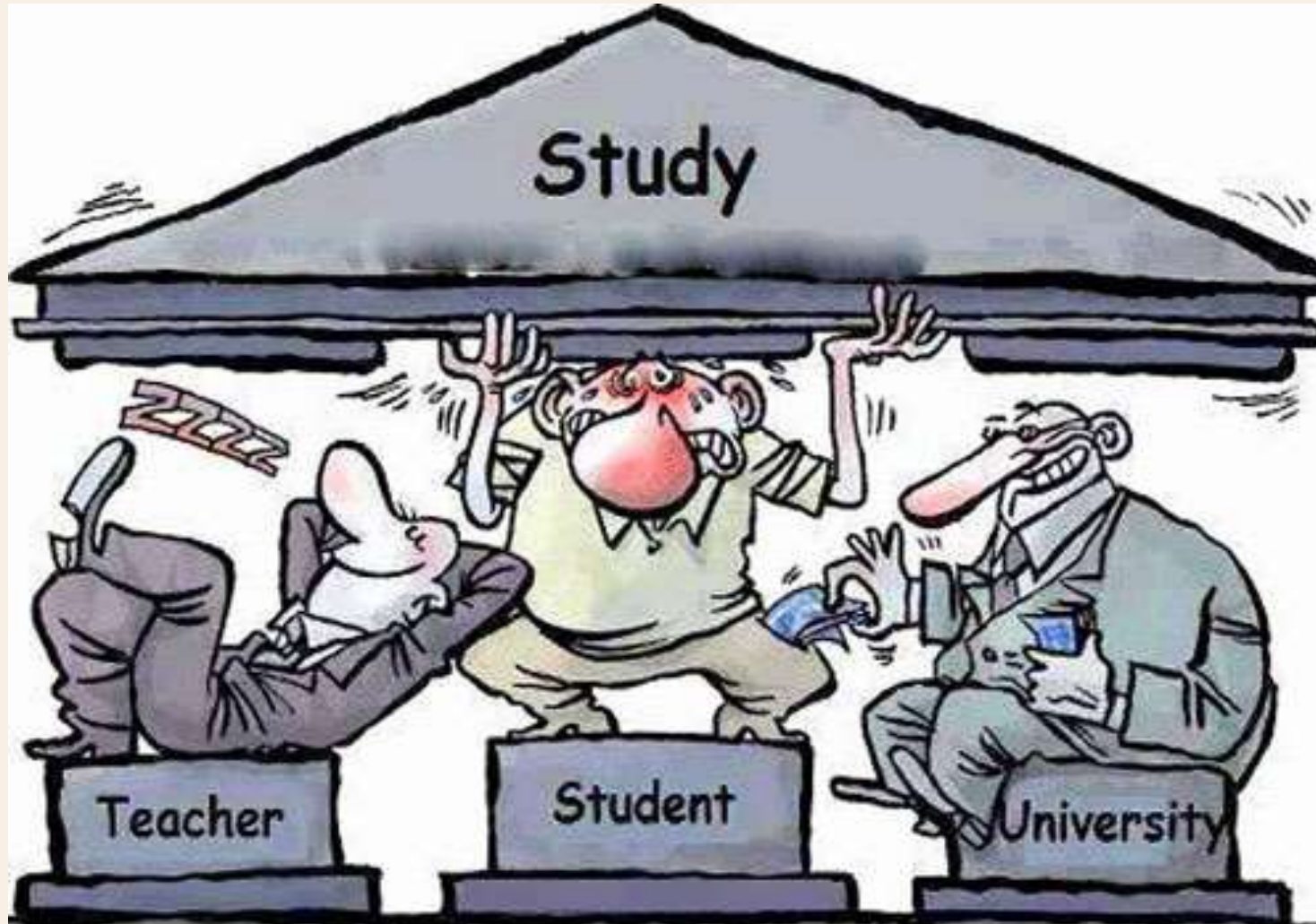
1. Education is not "useful"
2. Bureaucracy kills innovation
3. Based on fear and not love
4. Rational and serious, not "cool"
5. Poor response to digital challenges
6. Lack of creativity and spirituality
7. Emphasis on profession, not on passion
8. Learn but not unlearn
9. Learning vs. work, theory vs. practice
10. Change the culture, not the curricula.
11. There is no REAL search for a new paradigm



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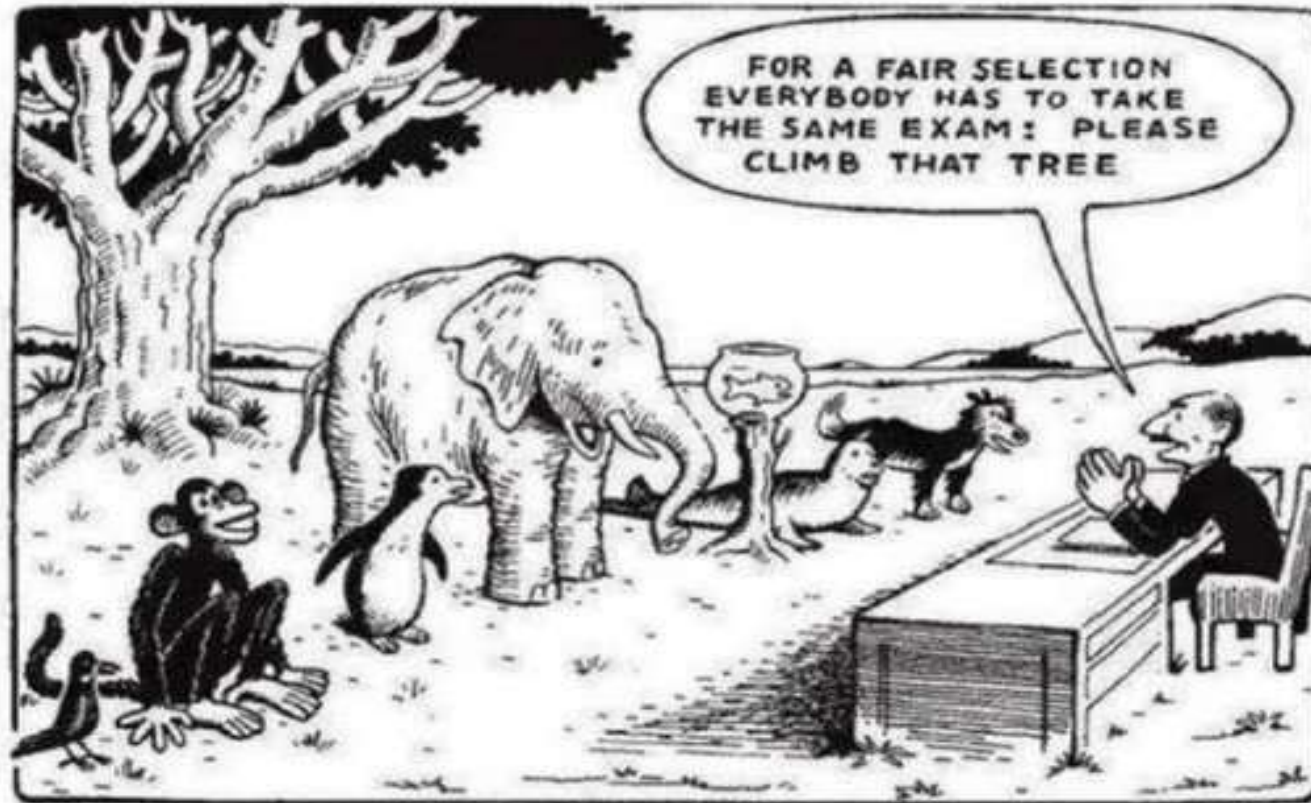

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Benkei and his „unlearning“



- Zen master Benkei founded a school for troubled students and gave them complete freedom. They could do whatever they wanted, except restrict the freedom of others.
- The worst children came from strict schools. It took them six months to vent their anger and revulsion.
- Afterwards, everyone wanted to study, because they could only follow subjects that interested them.
- Benkei explained his success: *Every child has an angel inside. Our attempts to shape him turn that angel into a devil. The children who come to my school are little devils, they hate the world, they are destructive, rude, they lie, they steal, they are angry. But in six months, they become happy, healthy children who never do anything bad anymore.*

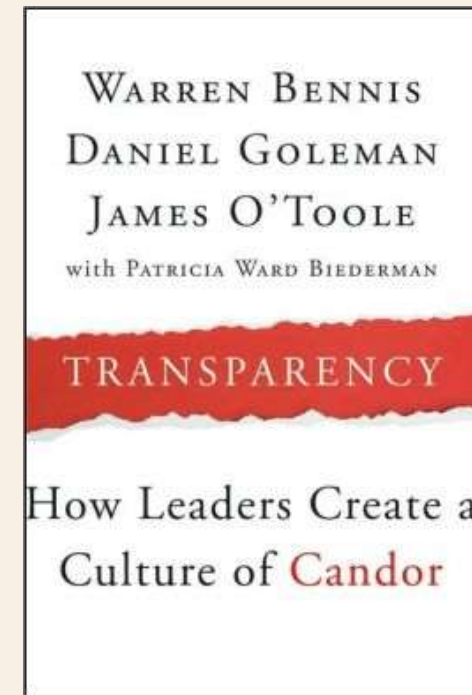
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Culture of Candor and Transparency

Questions are a problem?



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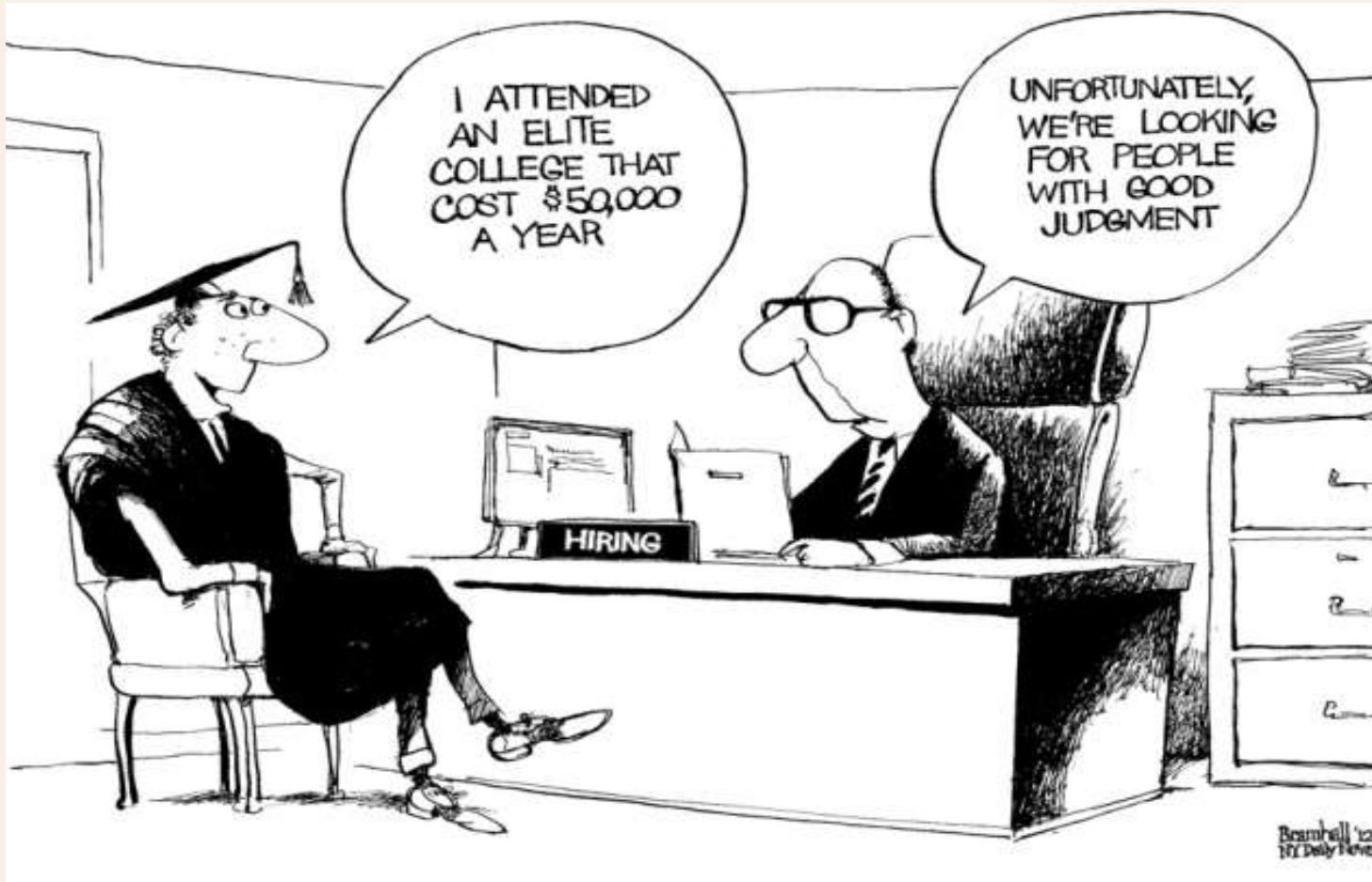
Culture of Patience and Persistence

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Diversification Culture

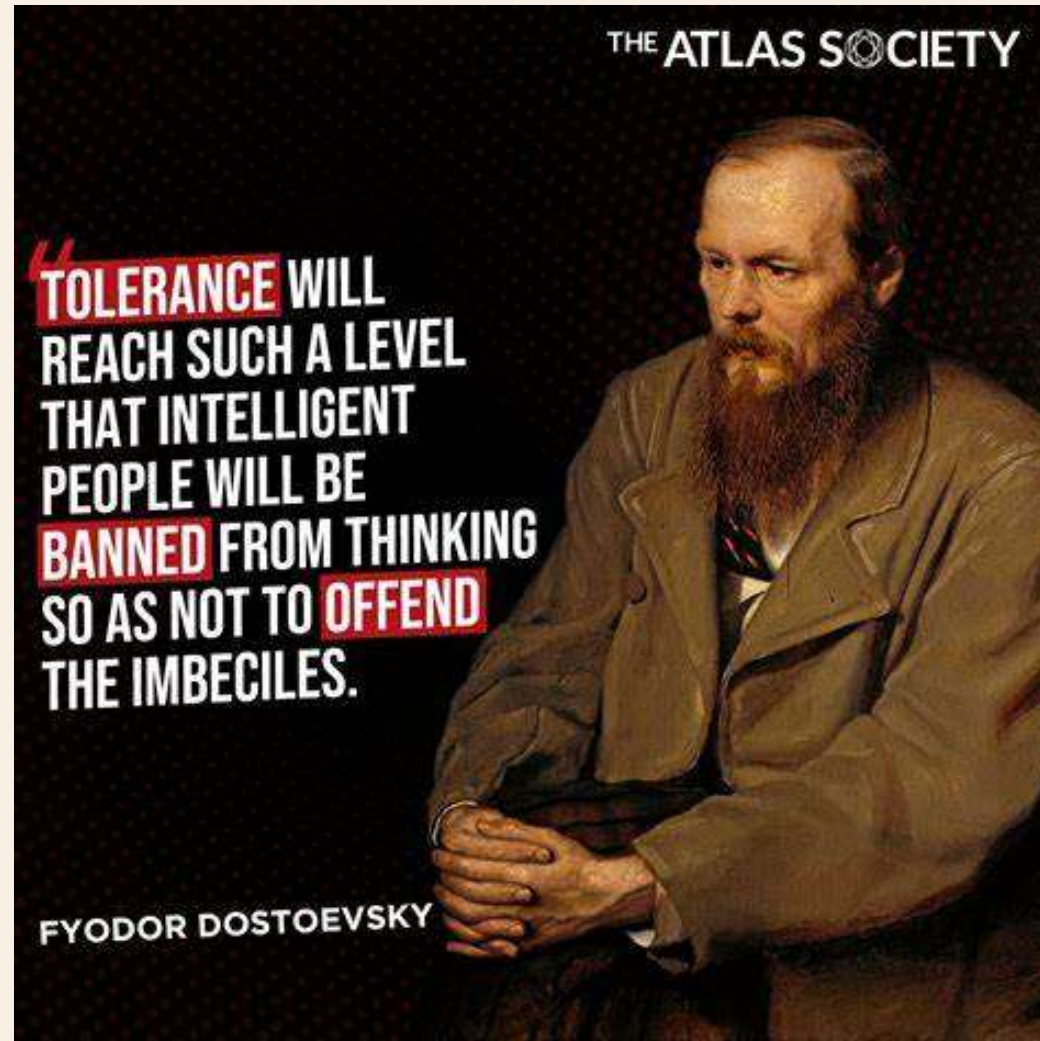
- Rule 20:70:10

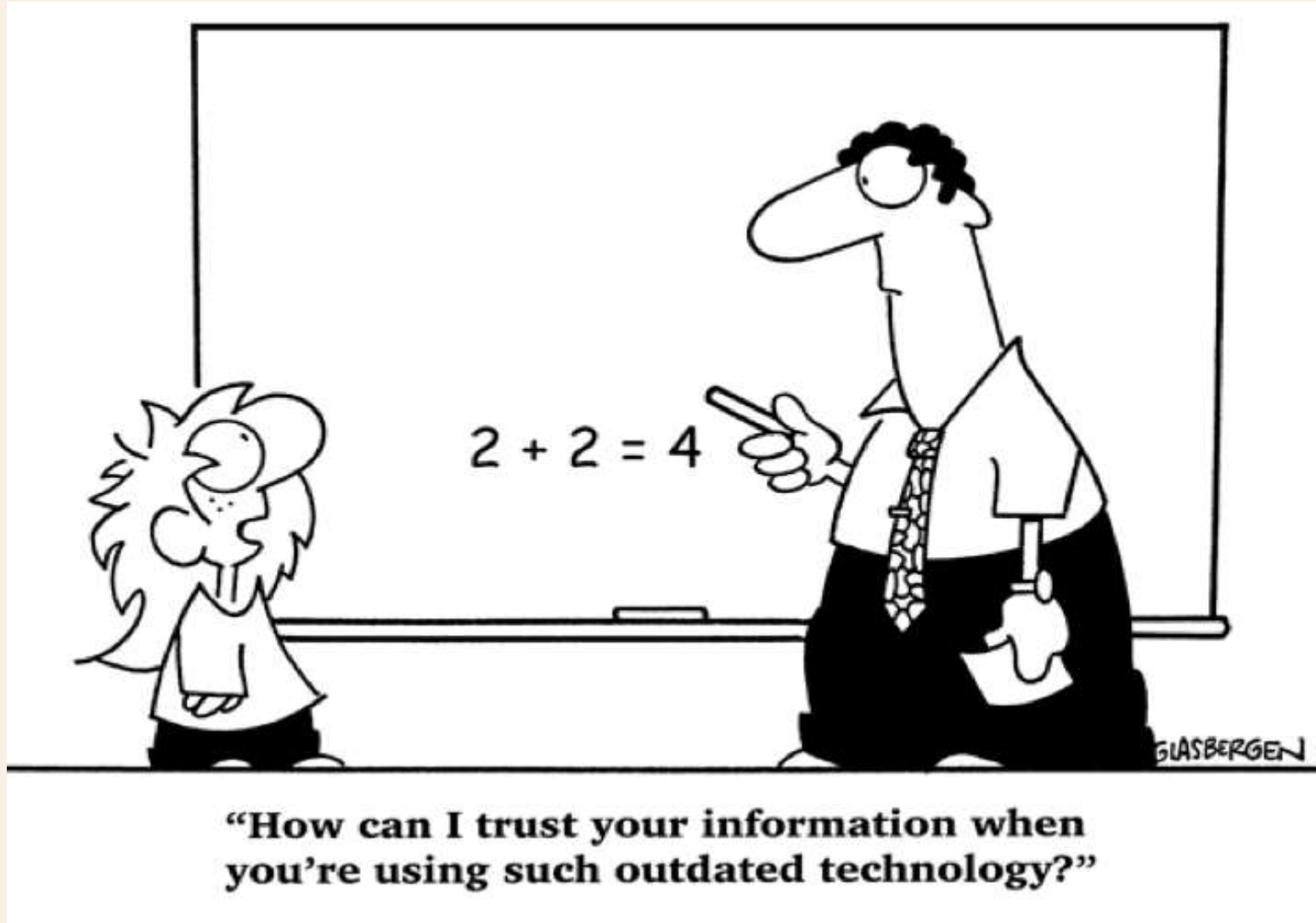
